

Administration on Aging Organizational Chart

The U.S. Administration on Aging (AoA) is led by the Assistant Secretary for Aging (ASA). Within the Immediate Office of the ASA, are the following:

1. Congressional and Public Affairs
2. National Long-Term Care Ombudsman

The Office of the Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary supports the Office of the ASA. Reporting directly to the Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary are the following:

1. Executive Secretariat
2. Regional Support Centers, which includes ten offices located in various regions of the United States.

The Office of Community Living Assistance Services and Supports (CLASS), under the direction of the ASA, manages the Community Living Assistance Services and Supports (CLASS) Program.

One other Deputy Assistant Secretary and two Center Directors report directly to the ASA and lead the Center for Management and Budget; the Center for Policy, Planning, and Evaluation; and the Center for Program Operations. These three Centers contain the remaining offices within AoA.

Reporting directly to the Acting Director of the Center for Management and Budget are the following offices:

1. Office of Budget and Finance
2. Office of Grants Management
3. Office of Administration and Personnel
4. Office of Information Resources Management

Reporting directly to the Acting Director of the Center for Policy, Planning, and Evaluation are the following offices:

1. Office of Program Innovation and Demonstration
2. Office of Performance and Evaluation
3. Office of Policy Analysis and Development

Reporting directly to the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Center for Program Operations are the following offices:

1. Office of Home and Community-Based Services
2. Office of Elder Rights
3. Office of American Indian, Alaskan Native, and Native Hawaiian Programs
4. Office of Outreach and Consumer Information
